SUBJECT: High School Articulated Credit

The purpose of this memorandum is to inform you of the change in procedures for awarding community college articulated credit for high school Career and Technical Education courses. This memorandum supersedes the criteria referenced in the North Carolina High School to Community College Articulation Agreement. The Committee for Developing the Criteria for Awarding Articulated Credit met on December 8, 2010. The committee recommended that the following criteria be used to award college credit for identified high school courses:

- 1. A grade of B or higher in the course, and;
- 2. A score of 93 or higher on the course post-assessment.

To receive articulated credit, students must enroll in the community college within two years of their high school graduation date.

This criterion is effective for the fall 2011 semester. A revised articulation agreement will be released for the 2012-13 school year.
