

Advance CTE compared the secondary and postsecondary indicators of performance in the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act (Perkins IV) and the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V), as well as examined alignment with performance measures in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).
