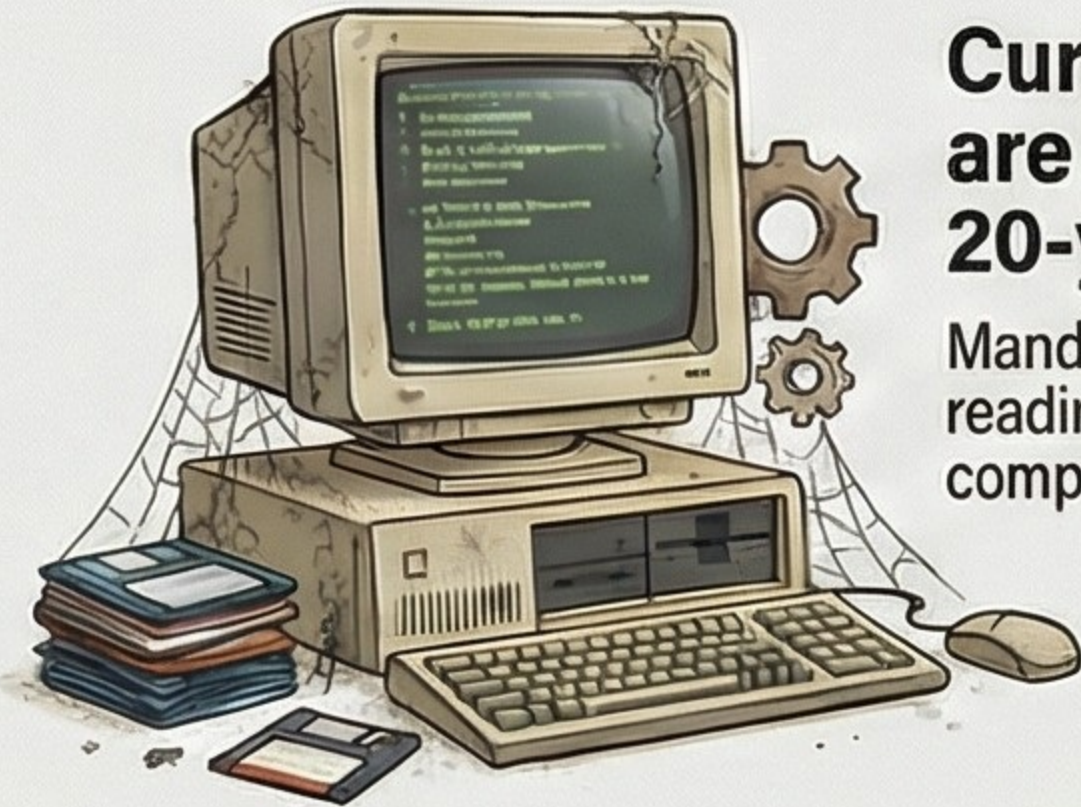


Modernizing Degree Competencies for Tomorrow's Workforce

North Carolina's current community college degree competency standards are based on outdated 1997-2003 accreditation criteria. A statewide project is now underway to modernize these standards, ensuring graduates possess the relevant, durable skills that employers need today and in the future.

THE CHALLENGE: OUTDATED STANDARDS



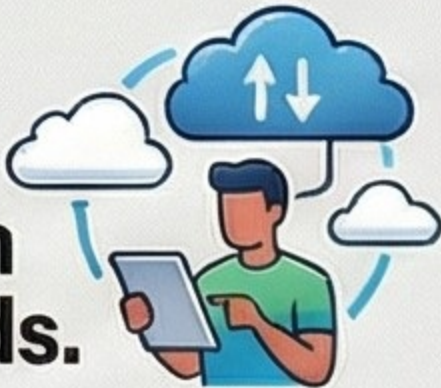
Current competencies are based on 20-year-old criteria.

Mandated skills include basic reading, writing, math, and computer use.



A gap exists between education and employer needs.

Workforce skills have evolved significantly, but required competencies have remained static.



THE GOAL: ANTICIPATED OUTCOMES



Modernized, Workforce-Aligned Competencies

The state code will reflect the durable skills employers actually expect.



THE PROCESS: A ROADMAP TO MODERNIZATION

(Timeline: By April 30, 2026)



1. Task Force Formation & Environmental Scan

Assemble experts, engage employers, and review peer frameworks and skills reports.



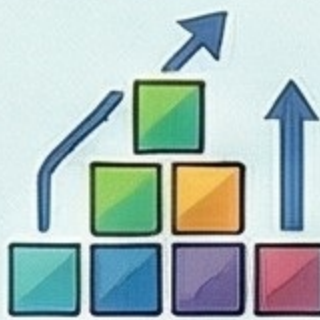
2. Drafting, Field Review & Revision

Develop new competency language and circulate drafts to stakeholders for feedback.



3. Code Amendment & Implementation Support

Submit new language for approval and provide faculty with resources and training.



Stronger Program Alignment & Faculty Support

Creates uniform expectations and provides faculty-ready resources for assessment.
